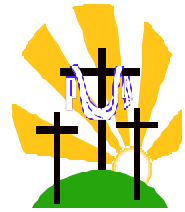

"Come, Ye Faithful, Raise the Strain"

The year 2004 is one of the few times that Passover and Orthodox Easter and our "Western" Easter all come simultaneously. That turned my thoughts to an Easter hymn from the Orthodox Church (Hymn 114) "Come, Ye Faithful, Raise the Strain." The hymn celebrates the Exodus of Israel (Passover) and then bursts into a stanza celebrating the resurrection of Christ: "Tis the spring of souls today, Christ has burst his prison."

This Greek hymn was written in the 7th Century by John of Damascus. Though born to an influential Christian family (his father was the financial advisor to the Caliph of Damascus), John got caught in political intrigue between the Byzantine Emperor and the Caliph, and decided to break away from society altogether. He joined the monastery of Mar Saba – one of the most remote monasteries, perched high on a cliff in the Judean wilderness. One writer has suggested

that isolated, bleak Mar Saba is the last place on earth where one might expect to find great hymns. Yet it is the source "of some of the most frequently-used and precious hymns in all our collections." [Albert Bailey, The Gospel in Hymns] You can just imagine John, abandoning a life of luxury in Damascus to live in a tiny monk's cell, perched on a chalky, treeless cliff overlooking a barren wasteland. Perhaps he envisioned God's hand leading the people of Israel across that wilderness, and, looking east from his cell window, could see the brilliant sunrise across the desert mountains, which reminded him of the splendor of Christ's resurrection. But that barren place enabled his soul to soar, and his spirit to sing, "Now rejoice Jerusalem, and with true affection, Welcome in unwearied strains, Jesus' resurrection!" John also gave us the Easter hymn that has been called "the Golden Canon" - "The Day of Resurrection..." In

that hymn he once again combines Passover with Easter:

"The Day of Resurrection! Earth tell it out abroad; The Passover of gladness, the Passover of God. From death to life eternal, from this world to the sky, Our Christ has brought us over with hymns of victory."

As we think of John of Damascus, this 7th Century monk, looking over the barren desert, awaiting the sunrise, perhaps we too can discover the spirit of Easter in our lives no matter this time of terrorist alerts, sudden violence, and increasing challenges to daily life. As we come into the spring season let us greet each new day, and may we hear the strains of this song of faith, passed on to us through the centuries by this desert monk, that singing the joys of Easter.

From Pastor Sharp's Book Corner

I would like to introduce you to a series of books by the author Jan Karon, that has brought me joy, amusement and escape. They are light reading, and are thoroughly infused with faith, hope and love. The series begins with At Home in Mitford and continues with these titles: A Light in the Window, These High, Green Hills, Out to Canaan, A New Song, A Common Life (The Wedding Story), In This Mountain, Shepherds Abiding.

Although Shepherds Abiding is a Christmas story, I really enjoyed it as my vacation reading when Dotty and I were in Florida last month. The main character is an Episcopal priest, Father Tim. He is a small-town rector in

an American village (Mitford, NC) where the grass is still green, the pickets are still white, and the air still smells sweet. Gail Hudson described these books as "much more than a gentle love story;.. a homespun tale about a town of endearing characters....who are as quirky and popular as those of Mayberry." What comes through, as you follow Father Tim through his ministry, courtship and marriage and retirement, is the powerful presence of grace and the ability of faith to transform everyday life into a wonder to behold. After several months of recommending more scholarly books for your reading, I offer us these books for pleasant reading, and promise they will lift your spirit and, most likely, strengthen your faith.

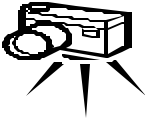
BOWLS ARE BACK!

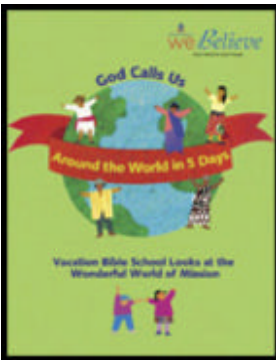
Wanted, Needed: A Volunteer Reward: Lifetime Appreciation at Govans

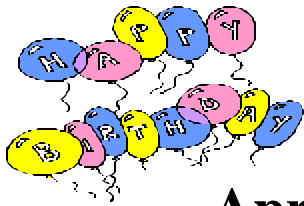
Summer Camp:
