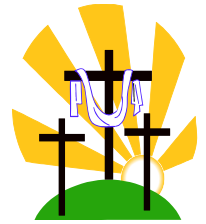

Welcome to the Music Director

William Wisnom, Govans' new music director, didn't start out playing an organ.

In fact, he began his music career as an 11-year-old studying piano in his hometown of Fawn Grove, Penn. He showed great promise and, two years later, came to Baltimore's Peabody Institute to study the instrument.

"I was going to be a piano major," he said. "But when I was 17 I heard a really good organ here in town at a church."

He was smitten.

"There's something about the energy of the instrument that can fill an entire room. You can hear and also feel it," said Wisnom, 25, who grew up in the Methodist tradition.

The chance encounter led to a

change in planned majors – he studied organs on a scholarship at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y. – and a new career opportunity.

He spent a year as an apprentice at Central Presbyterian under Leo Wanenchak, a well known organist who was then that church's music director. Wanenchak is now the assistant conductor of the Baltimore Choral Arts Society.

"This is my first church having a choir and being director of the whole program," Winsom said. "It's wonderful. It's an amazing learning experience."

For now he is commuting from Pennsylvania to Govans and working

I read recently that the Chinese pictograph for “busy” is composed of two characters: one for heart and one for killing. We are cooperating with the Planet Green recycling program,

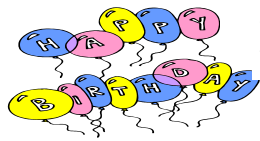
and receive free shipping costs of all the old ink cartridges plus \$1.50 per cartridge.

The Search for a New Pastor: What Happens Next?

How do we know what we want in a pastor? Someone like Jack? Like Neta? Not like either of them? One person wants one thing, another wants something quite different. The first step toward choosing is to do a Mission Study which then forms the basis for the Church Information Form. That form is filed with the denomination and is also available for candidates to help them know whether this is a church which might interest them and what kind of work will need to be done. The Session has authorized the use of Percept's Revision process. That has two main components.

but many of the questions are matched against extensive demographic information that will help us know more about the community around us. Who is out there? In what ways are they like us? Different from us? Are there needs which we can meet?

2. A series of small group meetings in homes using a curriculum which will guide the discussion.

The strength of Revision is its ability to include everyone. Of course that means you have to do something to be included: PARTICIPATE! Your voice can be heard, needs to be heard. You can be part of the future.

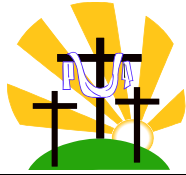
