## ENDOWMENT STATUS REPORT

The Presbytery has traditionally named May as a time to designate one Sunday as Wills Sunday and to consider support to church endowments. Thinking about one's will is not a topic that any of us likes to dwell on, and the Endowment Committee at Govans takes a slightly different approach. We are taking this chance to report to you on the status of our endowment, to remind us of how powerful a force it is in the life of our church and to remind us that (like the church) it can be an opportunity for growth beyond our day-to-day activities at Govans.

As of December 31, 2004 the balance held in our pooled Endowment Fund was \$1,562,570.54. Part of these funds are at work underwriting the cost of ongoing repairs to church properties. Our operating budget is based, in large part, on in-

come from these funds totaling over \$61,000.00. In other words, without the Endowment income our budget could not be supported.

Our endowment is literally a cornerstone of Govans' mission. It is a living testimony to the commitment of our congregation. More than that, it is a permanent tool used for the life of the church. Like anything else that lives, it needs to grow. Our long-range goal is to build the endowment to the point that its income will cover the costs of operating and maintaining the church buildings and property. Then, your offerings and giving could go directly to missions and personnel expenses.

Giving to our endowment can be done in any amount, at any time, and in

## Thoughts From The Pastor

They were complicated deaths, those of Terry Schiavo and Pope John II. Neither of them was quick or simple. Both of them raised questions about the nature of dying and at what point we stop trying to keep people alive. Front and center in that discussion were Christians saying life must go on at all costs. I kept thinking, "But it's Easter! Have you never heard of the resurrection?" Isn't it strange that was never factored into the discussions? Especially when you look at who was standing watch

outside the hospice in Florida. Remember how the Apostle's Creed ends: *I believe in the Holy Spirit; . . . the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.* I'm certainly not advocating a stance where we are casual about sending folk off into that new life, but if we truly do believe in the resurrection, then how does it affect our understanding of death—our own, and someone else's? Think about it.

This Summer, twenty people from the Presbytery of Baltimore (six are from Govans) will travel to Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota and hold the Hou Kola Learning Camp. The camp will tutor 40 Lakota children in reading, writing, math and computers while establishing friendship with the chil-

dren. Much of the expense of the camp is covered by raffling off a star quilt made by some of the Lakota women who want to help the camp.

Last year the raffle raised over \$900.00 to help offset the cost of the camp. This year we are raffling another beautiful

quilt and hope to use some of the money raised to help sponsor some Lakota youth as "C-I-T" counselors in training. These will be middle school youth who have participated in the past and show promise as future role models and leaders for the children on the Reservation.

Each Sunday until May 22, youth and adults will be selling raffle tickets in the Gallery. Look for the large poster showing the quilt. Tickets are \$3.00 each or two for \$5.00. Every dollar raised will go directly to the learning camp expenses.

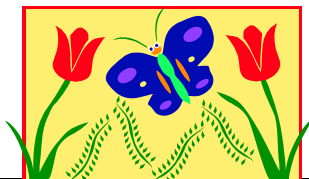
