The Mission Study is drawing to a close. Now it is time to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee and begin the actual search for a pastor. Every field has its own alphabet soup, and as we come into the time of searching for a new pastor, here is some of the "soup" that will be dished out to you:

CIF - The *Church Information Form* is the church's dossier that is filed with the denomination to be used in the matching process, and which is available at www.PCUSA.org for anyone to see. Ministers looking to make a move will be able to see it, as will you.

COM - Any call to a Presbyterian church is a three way call: the Minister, the individual church, and the Presbytery. The *Committee on Ministry* represents the Presbytery in working with our PNC as it conducts the search. They have appointed the Rev. Bruce Barstow as their representative to Govans.

PCUSA - *Presbyterian Church (USA)* is our particular brand of Presbyterian. There are others: PCA (Presbyterian Church of America), Cumberland Presbyterian, Orthodox Presbyterian, Bible Presbyterian.

PIF - The *Personal Information Form* parallels the CIF. It is filled out by Pastors seeking a position and filed with the denomination to be used in the matching process. Our PNC will receive PIFs to read and evaluate.

PNC - *Pastor Nominating Committee*. Elected by the congregation on September 25, this group will conduct the search for a new Pastor. They are a committee of the congregation, not the Session. The work of the PNC begins with PIFs. From this they will identify individuals who might be possibilities, interview them several times, check their references, and learn as much as possible about the skills they bring. They will bring one candidate for your approval.

Hear Our Voices: The Return of the Choir

After a summer hiatus, the beloved Govans Presbyterian Church choir returns to the 11 a.m. service this month with some familiar voices – and some changes.

Music Director Bill Wisnom says the choir was one of the things that attracted him to Govans and he is looking forward to his first full season with the singers.

“They are absolutely wonderful people to work with. They have a lot of passion and are intuitive musicians,” Wisnom says. “I really missed them.”

The first practice is scheduled for Sept. 8. The date of their return to Sunday services was still being determined at press time, but should be early September, Wisnom says.

The director says he has no wholesale changes planned, but does intend to expand the unit’s repertoire with the addition of more 20th century music, as well as some ethnic music.

“I’d like to explore some different genres and time periods,” he says.

He also is hoping to boost the bell choir, with children and adults, and launch a concert series using area musicians on special events – such as a potluck dinner night.

There are spots available in both the bell and voice choir for budding musicians. Tenors and altos would be particularly welcome. Wisnom says he would also like to hear from instrumentalists interested in participating in services. Call him at 717.382.4771 if you are interested.

Event participants will deepen their understanding and application of active nonviolence by examining the prevalence of violence, interpreting the principles of nonviolence, studying the dynamics of social movements, extending community-building and developing an action plan. It is built on teachings of Jesus Christ, examines current Christian practices, and studies the dynamics of social movements, cultural and religious understanding, and examples from the work of Gandhi and other nonviolence leaders around the world. Using an interactive, popular education approach to learning, the training involves participants and elicits information from them through a variety of media and utilizing different learning styles. It will ground participants in the creative, liberating, and democratic power of active nonviolence that can transform individuals, relationships, systems, and cultures.

ADULT OPTIONS: Begins Sunday, September 18, 2005

The Adult Ministry Area has scheduled an exciting and engaging series of topics for the Fall season. We will begin our four week series on "*In Life and Death We Belong to the Lord*" on September 18 and continue each Sunday at 10:00 a.m. in Sharp Hall through October 9. This series examines issues surrounding death and dying, including living wills and advance directives, preparing for and facing the sudden death of a loved one, what the Bible has to offer on the subject, and insights from hospice workers and medical professionals. 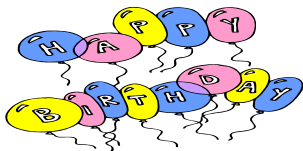
